CHALLENGES IN THE DEVELOPMENT OF A PRICE INDEX FOR EMPLOYMENT SERVICES IN THE UK

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Current status

- experimental CSPI in existence since 1997
- about 6% of top-level CSPI
- represents key services within whole range of employment services (i.e. a proxy)

The industry:

- covers all aspects of selection, referral and placement activity
- classified as "Labour recruitment and provision of personnel" on UK SIC
- UK CSPI focuses mainly on placement of personnel - although prices often reflect other activities too
- executive search ("head-hunting") not covered by CSPI

Current sample (panel):

- 63 companies
- cross-referenced industry list with ONS business register
- several large companies classified outside the sector
- 268 price quotes provided every quarter

Price collection (1):

- fees or hourly/weekly rates for temporary staff
- fees or percentages of salary for permanent staff (later combined with estimates of average earnings)
- prices often related to actual contracts with employers
- method at discretion of responders

Price collection (2):

- structure based on occupational groups (Standard Occupational Classification - SOC)
- all 9 SOC categories used for temporary staff,
 4 for permanent
- (about 90% of activity relates to temporary staff)
- regional aspect to sampling

Standard Occupational Classification (SOC)

Main categories

- 1. Managers and administrators
- 2. Professional occupations
- 3. Assistant professional and technical occupations
- 4. Clerical and secretarial occupations
- 5. Craft and related occupations
- 6. Personal and protective service occupations
- 7. Sales
- 8. Plant and machine operators
- 9. Other

Example price quotes

 Temporary staff; clerical and secretarial; data entry clerk; 1 month contract, per hour.

• Permanent staff; managers and administrators; team leader, salary over £35k; percentage fee.

Average earnings data

- results obtained from "New Earnings Survey" carried out by ONS
- for each main SOC category
- annual data with quarterly projections (subject to revisions)
- national results only, no regional figures
- affects 10% of index

Difficulties

- weightings not representative
- extending to other employment agency services
- price effects, e.g. whether agency employs the staff or not
- changes to contracts/service specifications
- timeliness of earnings data
