QUESTIONNAIRE ON STATISTICS ON TRADE IN SERVICES

INTRODUCTION

- 1. The present questionnaire was prepared within the framework of the joint programme of various international organizations (United Nations Statistical Office, UNCTAD, United Nations Centre on Transnational Corporations, IMF, GATT, OECD, EUROSTAT) to improve service statistics in general and statistics on trade in services in particular. Its main purpose is to collect information on national practices in the compilation of data on trade in services and to solicite views on various conceptual and methodological problems. This information will in turn be used to formulate international guidelines at a later stage. It is circulated to national statistical offices and to balance of payment compilers at the same time.
- 2. In order to facilitate the answers to the questions, two background documents are annexed. The first was prepared by the United Nations Statistical Office and is entitled "The Concept of Services in Statistics". The second was prepared jointly by the United Nations Statistical Office and the International Monetary Fund and is entitled "Special Problems of Statistics on International Trade in Services". Respondents are requested to answer the questions in conjunction with the two background documents. Wherever appropriate, references are given to the particular parts of the background documents. The first figure indicates the

paragraph number, the second the document number, the United Nations

Statistical Office document being I, the joint United Nations

Statistical Office/IMF document being II. For instance, 14/II referes to para. 14 of the document "Special Problems of Statistics on International Trade in Services."
