International comparability

- NAICS 2002
 - 2 digit level aimed for (ANZSIC subdivision)
 - Most contemporary industrial classification with supply side framework

● ISIC Rev. 4 – input into

- Conceptual framework paper
- Increased use of supply side conceptual basis for new industry categories
- Retreat from using institutional sector concept for Public Admin activities
- Divisional structure
- Details of structure
- Progress on treatment of outsourcing (commission manufacturing)

- Where are ANZSIC not comparable with ISIC?






Divergence: Division level




