Structural Business Statistics

- SBS describe economy through activities of enterprises
- Main SBS variables are:
 - Demographic variables (e.g. number of enterprises)
 - "Input related" variables
 - labour input (e.g. employment, personnel costs)
 - capital input (e.g. investment, R&D)
 - "Output related" variables (e.g. turnover, value added).

Structural Business Statistics

- Reference period year
- Harmonised methodology comparisons over time and space
- Complications:
 - Current prices and different ways of implementation in NSIs
 - No PPPs
- Activity vs. product based
- Enterprise vs KAU



Legal basis of SBS

- Basic regulation for Structural Business Statistics
 Council Regulation N° 58/97
- Annex 1, a common annex for annual structural statistics (all activities in Sections C to K and M to O, currently only pilot studies are foreseen for M-O).
- Annex 2, a detailed annex for structural statistics in industry.
- Annex 3, a detailed annex for structural statistics in distributive trades.
- Annex 4, a detailed annex for structural statistics in construction.

Legal basis of SBS

- Annexes include information about:
 - activities, for which the statistics are to be compiled
 - type of statistical units used: enterprise, local unit, kind of activity unit
 - list of characteristics for which statistics are to be compiled (e.g. number of enterprises, number of employees, and so on)
 - frequency for the compilation, in this case, yearly or multiyearly
 - timetable, with the first reference years for the statistics to be compiled
 - standards of representativeness and quality evaluation

- Regulation N° 2056/2002 of the European Parliament and of the Council
 - Annex 6, a detailed module on credit institutions:
 NACE Rev. 1.1 classes 65.12 and 65.22
 - Annex 7, a detailed module on pension funds:
 NACE Rev.1.1 class 66.02

Voluntary data collections

- Business Demography
- Other financial intermediation services and financial auxiliaries
- Foreign Affiliates Statistics
- Business Services
- Inter-enterprise relations and demand for services

SBS framework

- Implementation of the SBS Regulation in 1995
- 1995-1998 was a transitional period
- SBS data is more complete starting from reference year 1999
- Currently, the EU Structural Business Statistics is a well-functioning framework

Development of Structural Business Statistics

Establishment of priorities

 Limited resources, priority setting in co-operation between NSIs and Estat, plan for action but flexible -> 3-year rolling programme

A step-wise approach

 Inventory of existing situation (collection of data and methodolgy), methodological development, harmonised data collection and preparation of legal framework

Financial framework

 Financing of specific development actions with the help of Commission political departments - close co-operation with DG Enterprise

NSI activities can be partly covered by subventions

SBS amendment proposals

- Extension of the common, horizontal annex1 – more variables at class level of NACE
- Annex 8 on Business Services
- Annex 9 on Business Demography
- Flexible module on Ad Hoc Surveys



Scope

- 72 Computer and related services
- 74.11 Legal services
- 74.12 Accounting and auditing services
- 74.13 Market research and public opinion polling services
- 74.14 Business and management consultancy services
- 74.20 Architectural, engineering and related technical consultancy
- 74.30 Technical testing and analysis services
- 74.40 Advertising services
- 74.50 Labour recruitment and provision of personnel services

- Two main elements:
 - Turnover broken by product
 - Turnover broken by client
- Link to NACE Rev.2
 - BS are based on NACE Rev.1.1
 - Computer services as an aggregate
 - Other business services no major problems
 - New perhaps not so interesting sectors
 - New interesting sectors outside the scope of E



Product breakdown

- More and better information on production of main activity and supplementary activities
- Specific and related products
- Mixed results:
 - main products do not reflect the economic reality
 - not appropriate related products
- Gain more experience with new surveys



Link to CPA revision

- BS are based on CPA with adaptations
- Annex 8 final product lists determined only at a later stage - preferably CPA
- Problems with timing:
 - Planned first reference year 2006 for BS while 2008 for revised NACE and CPA
 - Old product lists 2006-7
 - Old and new product lists 2008
- Co-ordinate the two excercises as far as possible

- SBS Regulation implemented in 1995
- 1995-1998 was a transitional period
- more complete from 1999 onwards
- EU SBS a well-functioning framework
- rolling 3-year work programme for development
- BS an integral part of the rolling programme
