# Industry classifications

<b>ISIC Rev. 4</b>	<b>6 industries</b>
<b>NACE Rev. 2.0</b>	<b>6 industries</b> (identical to ISIC)
<b>JSIC</b>	<b>16 industries</b>
<b>ANZSIC 2006</b>	<b>4 industries</b>
<b>NAICS</b>	<b>15 industries</b>

# Industry classifications

## Similarities

- most support activities broken down by means of transport (such as running of transport facilities)
- Warehousing and storage, freight forwarding classified independently from mean of transport

## Differences

- Warehousing and storage not always part of support activities
- Cargo handling not always as separate industry

<b>CPC Ver. 2.0</b>	<b>25 subclasses</b>
<b>CPA 2008</b>	<b>31 sub-categories</b>
<b>ANZSPC 2006</b>	<b>18 items</b>
<b>NAPCS</b>	<b>35 products</b>

# Product classifications

## Characteristics

- **CPC**
  - warehousing and storage part of support services
- **CPA**
  - structure similar to CPC
- **ANZSPC**
  - „Cargo handling“ and „storage and warehousing“ part of Division „Supporting and Auxiliary Transport Services“
- **NAPCS**
  - very detailed
  - contains maintenance and repair services
  - Warehousing and storage services in a different group
