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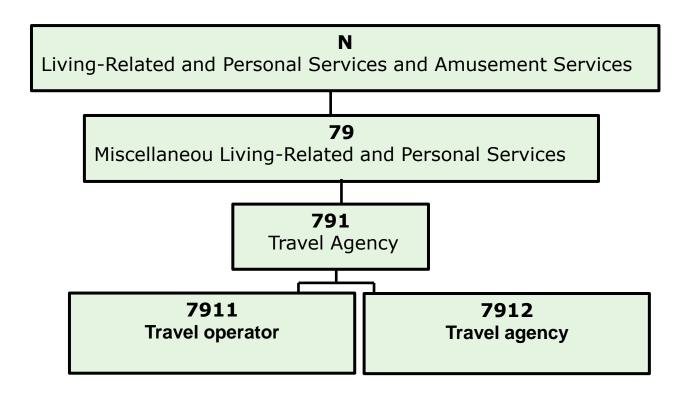

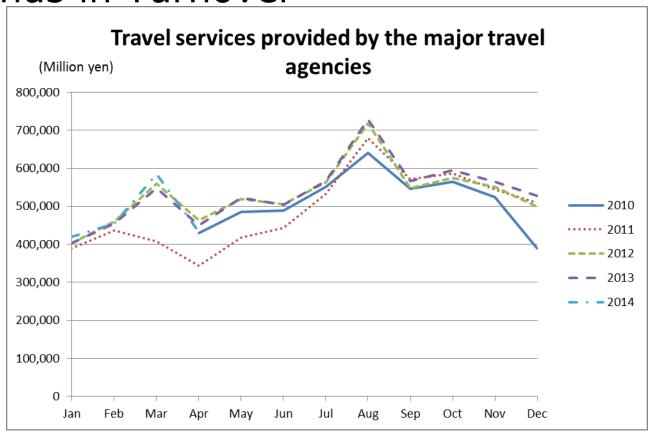

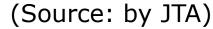

#### Trends in Turnover

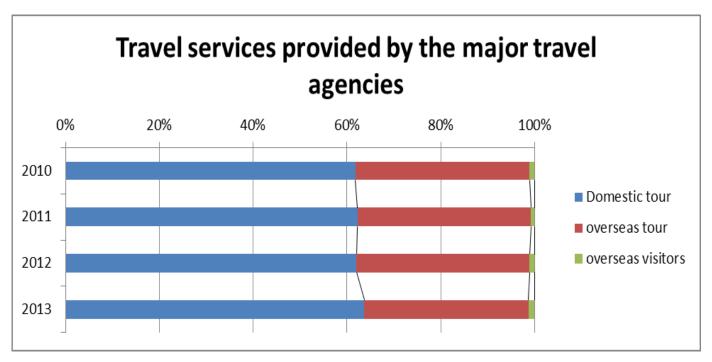

#### 5. Turnover data methods

## MSSI (Monthly)

- Sample survey
- Questionnaires distributed & collected by mail (also available online)
- Total turnover of entity, turnover of enterprise by business activity
- Preliminary results: 2 months after survey
- Final results: 5 months after survey



#### 5. Turnover data methods

#### MSSI (Annual)

- Sample survey
- Questionnaires distributed & collected by mail (also available online)
- Total turnover of entity, turnover of enterprise by business activity
- Preliminary results: the end of December of the survey year
- Final results: around autumn of the next year



## 5. Turnover data methods (Cont.)

#### □ 2012 ECBA

- Questionnaires distributed & collected by enumerators or by mail (also available online)
- Total annual turnover of entity, turnover of entity by business activity
- Preliminary tabulations released in January (1-digit level) and March (Manufacturing , 2-digit level), 2013
- Final tabulations released in August (3-digit level),
  November, 2013 and February, 2014
- Also collect financial items, and tabulate value added



## 6. Comparability of turnover and price data

#### Price data

- Only CPI is available for Travel Agency
- Weight for CPI is household consumption expenditure
- Product (item) basis





## 7. Summary

- Turnover collected by business activity
  - By revision of MSSI, we can grasp monthly turnover by business activity of entities whose principal activity is Travel Agency.
  - Total annual turnover is released at 3-digit industry level by annual survey (MSSI).

#### ECBA

In 2012, turnover and other financial items of all entities of all industries were surveyed for the first time.
