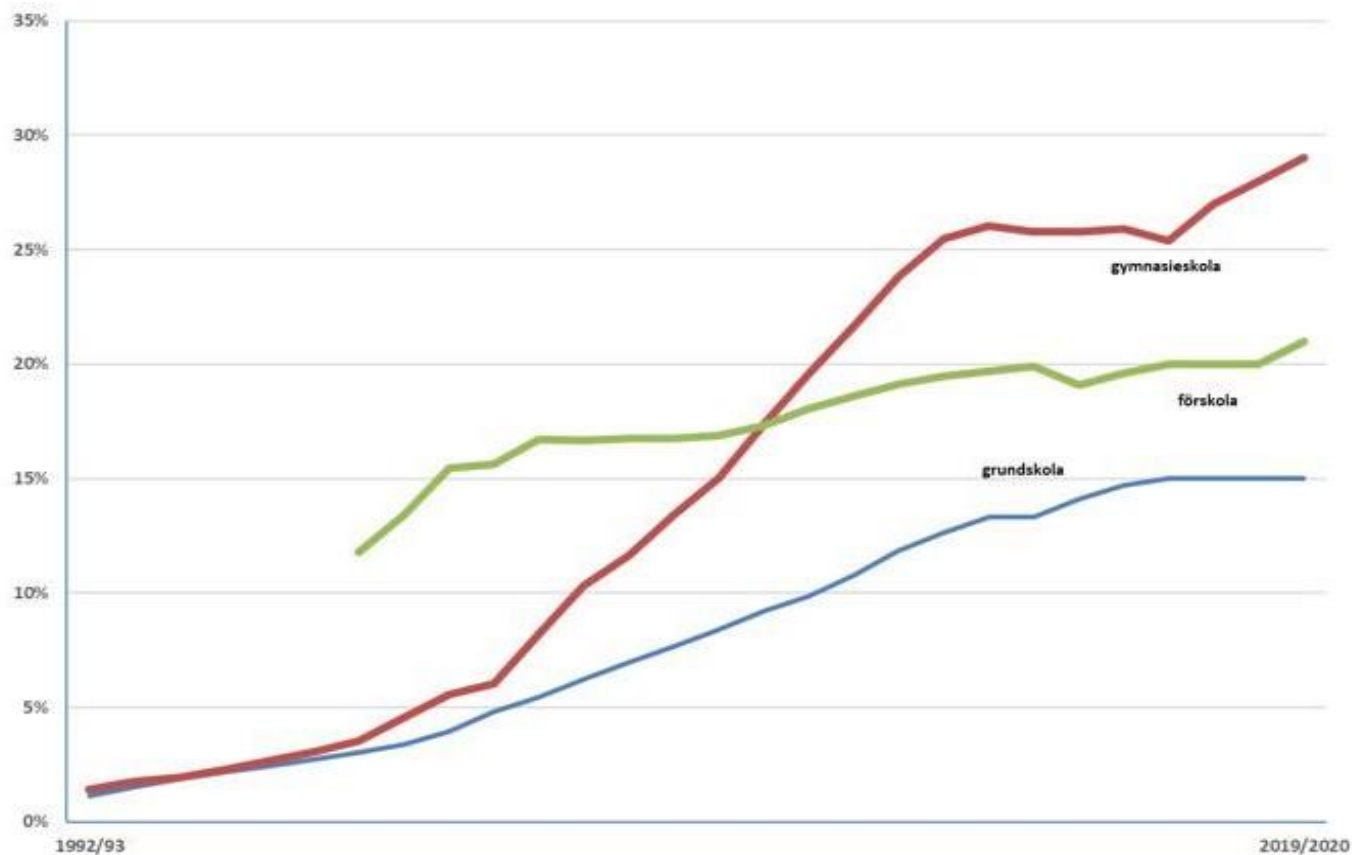


Market for education in Sweden

- Mainly in the public sector
- “The independent school reform” in 1992 allowed education in market producing enterprises
- Increasing number of market producers since mid 1990s

Market producers in education contributed with

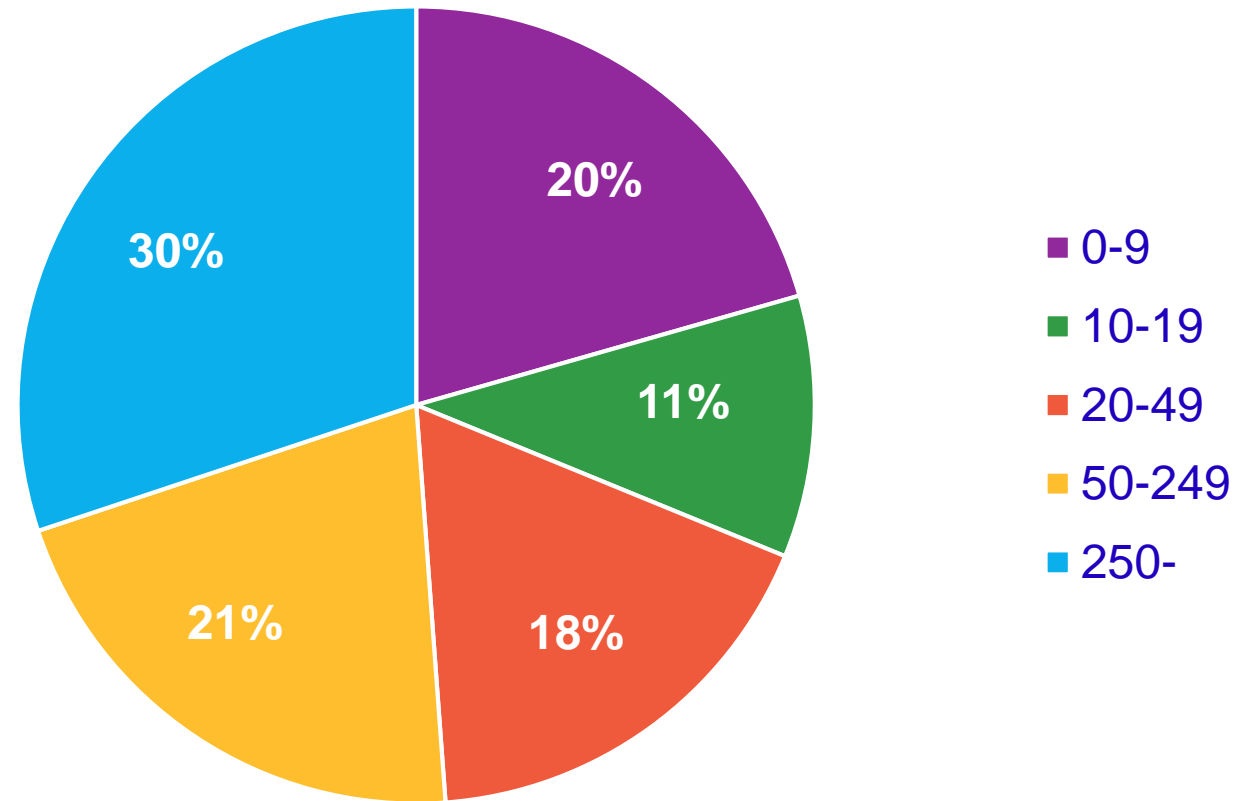
- 2.6 % of enterprises and employees

in the total business sector 2020

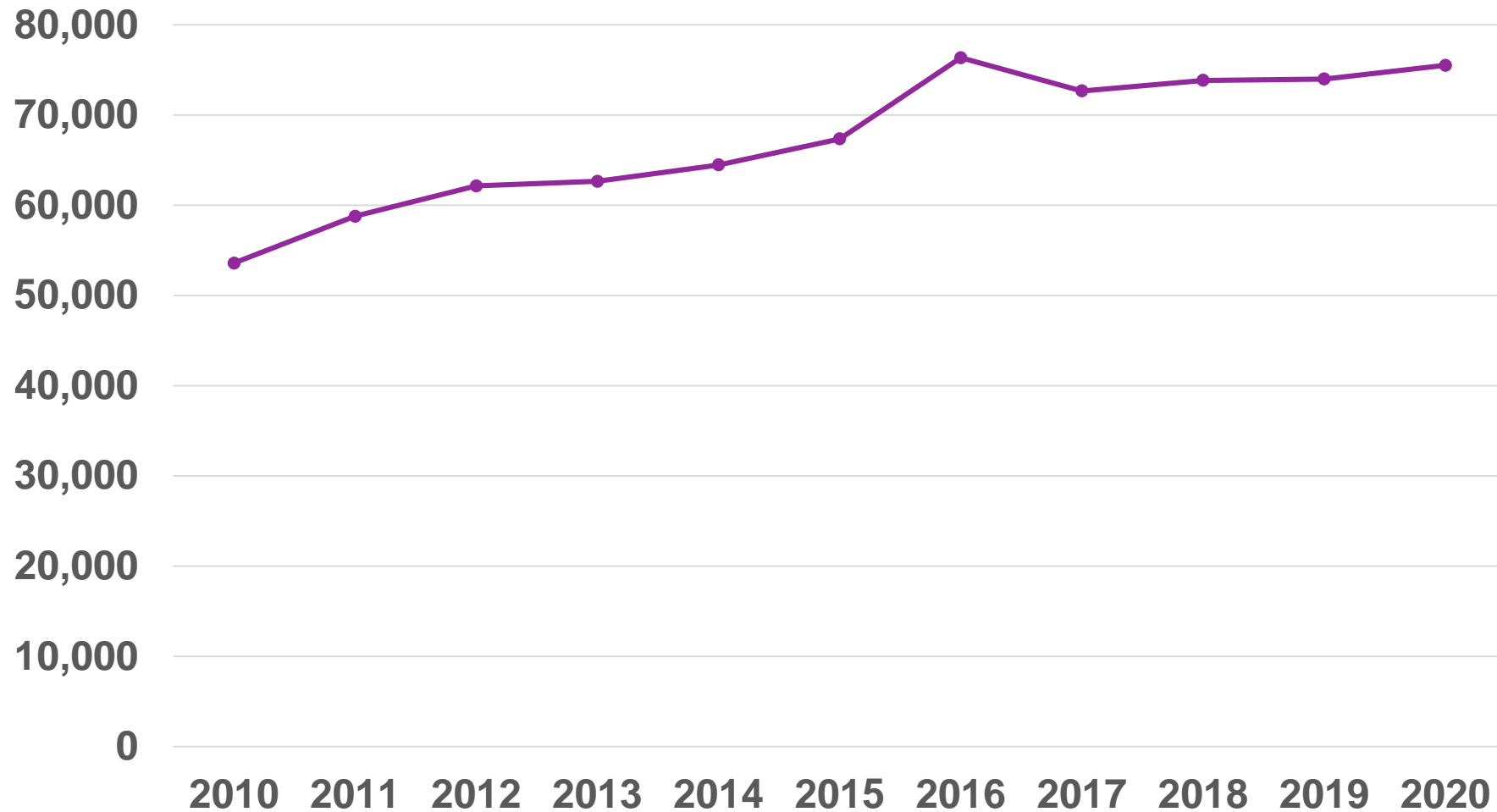

Number of employees per size class (SBS 2020)

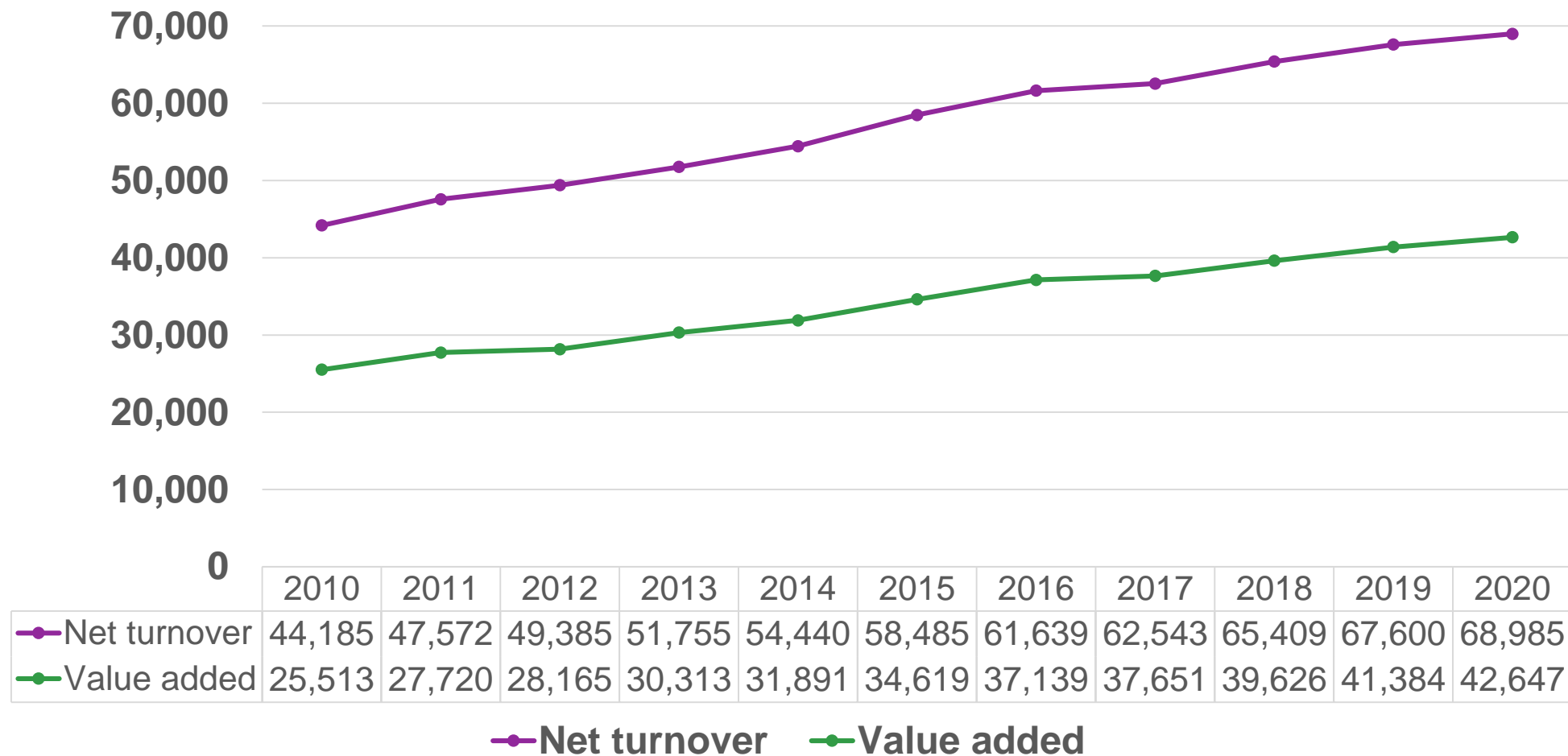


Number of employees 2010-2020

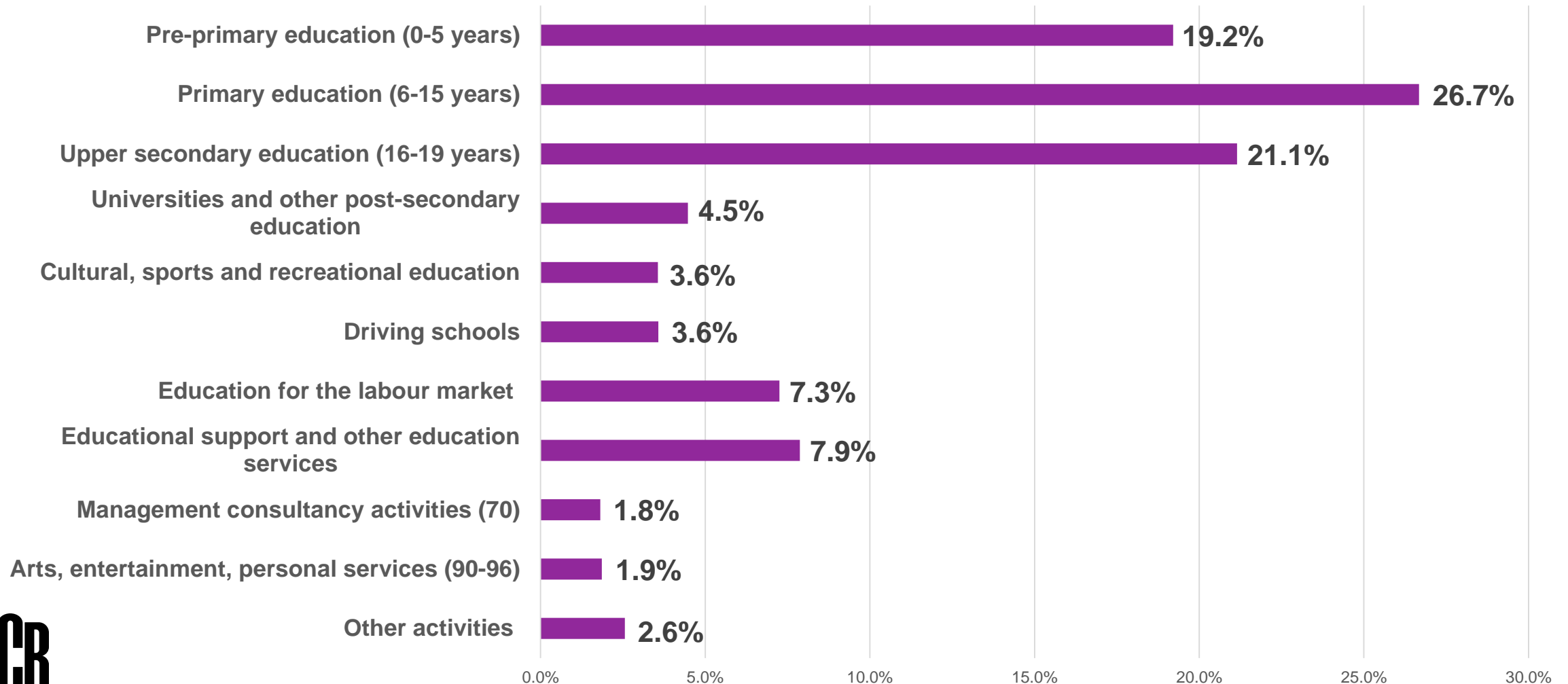


Net turnover and value added 2010-2020

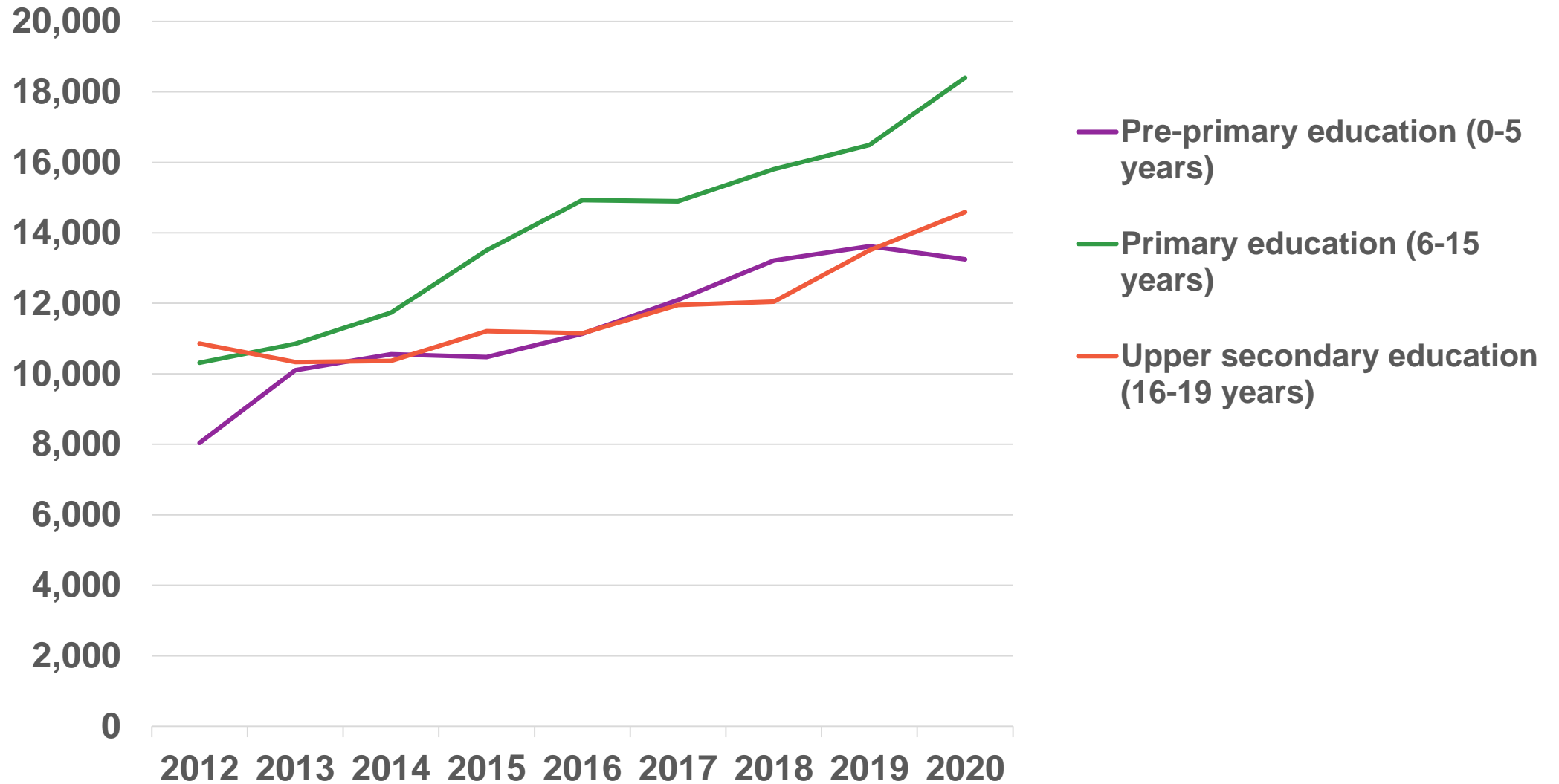

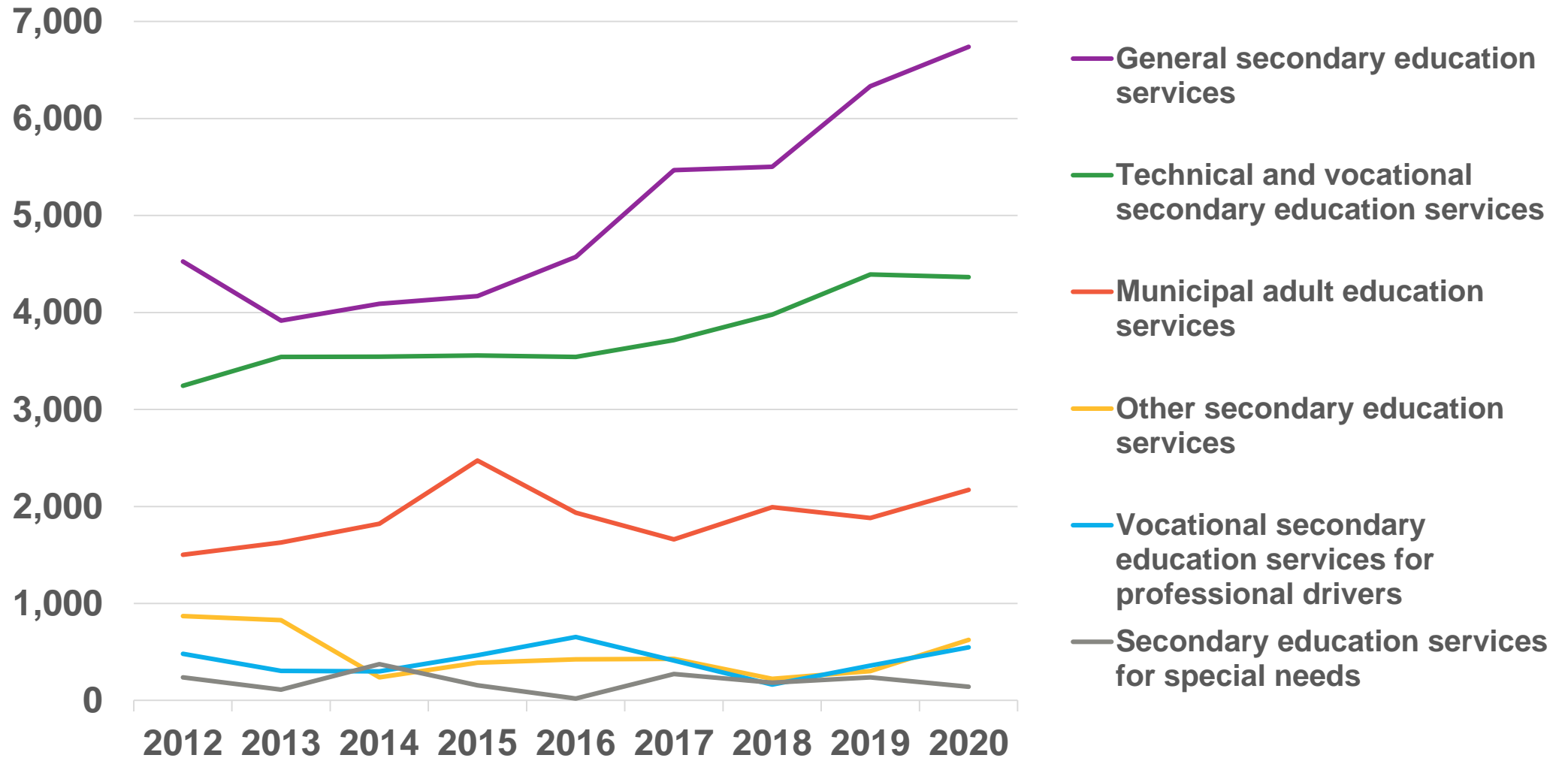
Net turnover by product 2020, percent



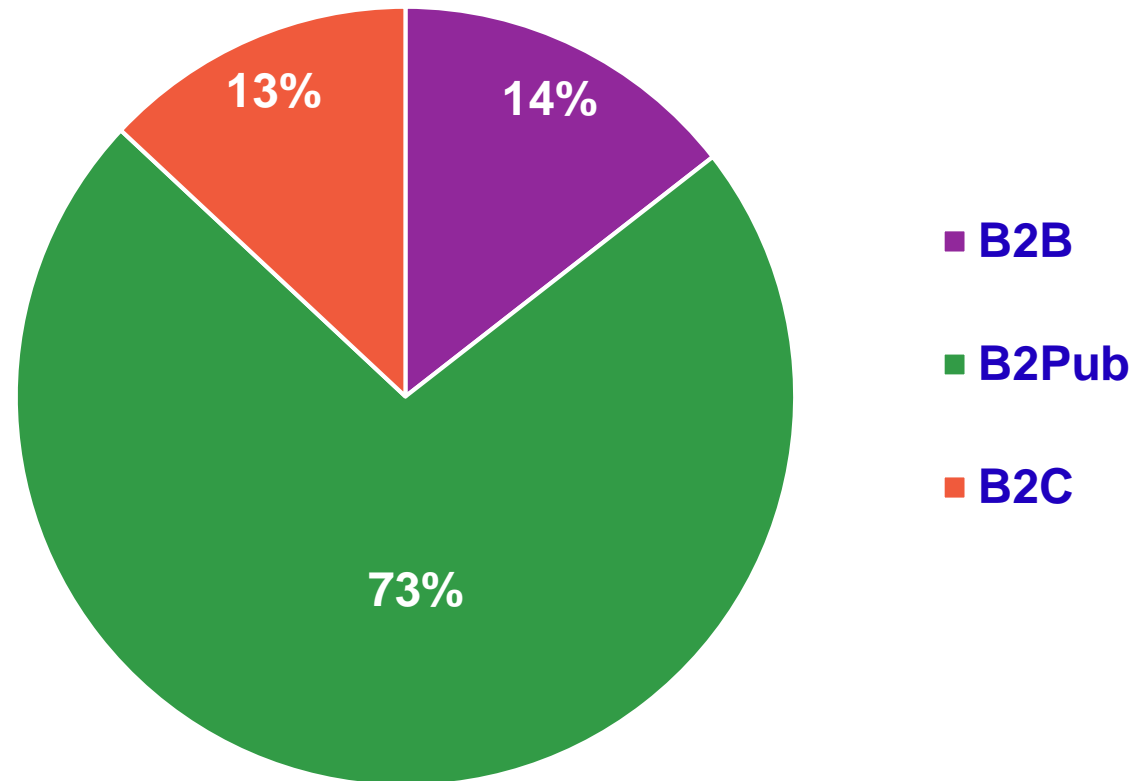
Net turnover for the 3 largest product groups in Education 2012-2020, MSEK
